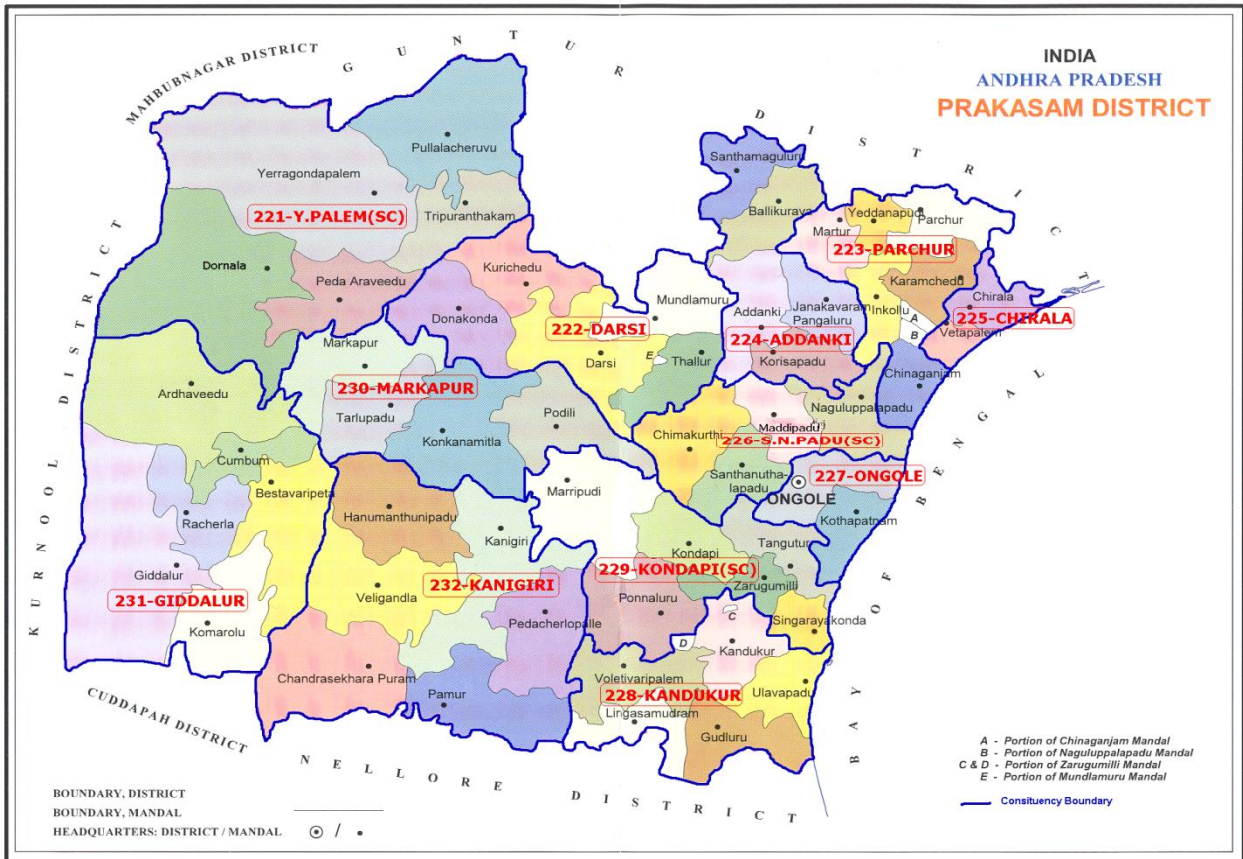

Prakasam District has a coastal line of 102 K.M comprising of 11 Mandals (i.e) Chirala, Vetapalem, Chinaganjam, N.G.Padu, Ongole, Kothapatnam, Tangutur, Zarugumalli , S.Konda, Ulavapadu, and Gudlur and generally experience cyclone floods during the months of April / May and October / November.

Immediately on receipt of Preliminary Cyclone warning, an emergency control room will be opened in the Tahsildar and to ensure all instructions contained in the Cyclone Plan are communicated to all concerned and the plan is put into operation immediately.

Duties to be performed after receipt of Second Warning:

- The Officers drafted to the Villages, which are within 5 KMs from the Sea Coast, which are likely to be affected, for evacuation and shelters and places where the people have to be moved.
- The Tahsildar shall see that the staff drafted for the purpose are moved to their respective places and take up evacuation of the people to the shelters immediately. Food, Water, other arrangements should be made in the shelter.
- The Motor Vehicle Inspector will see the required lorries and other vehicles for evacuation and keep at the disposal of the Tahsildar.
- All the Departmental Officers shall be present in Head Quarters with their staff and shall be available for attending to cyclone pre and post operations entrusted to them.

Pre-cyclone safety measures:

- Mandal Team, and concerned VRO's Panchayat Secretaries and habitation committees shall take steps to educate the public about the precautionary measures.
- Fishermen should be warned not to venture into the sea.
- The villagers should be advised to keep (1) Hurricane lanterns filled with Kerosene, Torch lights with enough dry cells, candles (2) not to take shelter near the trees (3) to stock enough food grains (4) to keep extra drinking water (5) evacuate cattle from the low lying areas well in advance (6) to shift to a safest place if the house cannot withstand the violent cyclone storm or if the house is situated in low lying area.
- Habitation Committees have been formed in all the including affected habitations with the members ie., President, Vice-president, MPTC, ward members, Anganvadi workers, ANMs are members in the committees. They should be co-ordinate all the activities at the relief centers.

Post cyclone Measures:

- The FIs, EDTs (Civil Supplies), Dy Tahsildars shall visit the relief centers and obtain the information of evacuees from the Relief Center In charge officer and furnish the requirement of food packets in each of the relief Center. The lists of evacuees shall be got approved by the Tahsildar. They should approach the Hotel authorities for preparation and pack of the food as per Government norms.
- Immediately after Cyclone the rescue and relief teams should be pressed into service. The Relief teams should establish contact with affected villages and visit all the villages by using all available modes of transport. The Tahsildar shall ensure to build up photographic record of the damages. The teams shall assess Human loss, Livestock loss, Loss to private and public Properties, Loss to crops, damages to lands and other losses if any and submit assessment reports to the Tahsildar. The Tahsildar in turn shall furnish the preliminary loss report to the Collector / RDO. The Tahsildar shall also report to the Collector, the probable amount required to meet the relief operations.

CYCLONE SHELTERS:

- There are 71 Cyclone Shelters in the District. The Tahsildars of Coastal mandals should inspect all cyclone shelters and report the present condition of the cyclone shelters as to whether the shelters are in good condition to accommodate the evacuees and furnish fitness certificates. They should also report the details of repairs to be carried out to the shelters if necessary.
- The EE (PR), Ongole, Parchur and Kandukur should inspect all cyclone shelters under their control for maintenance and ensure that they are in good condition, keeping in view the ensuing cyclone season.

CONTROL ROOMS

- Whenever the cyclone warnings are received from the Cyclone Warning Center, Visakhapatnam, a control room will be opened at "D" Section of Collector's Office, Ongole to watch the result of Cyclone activities with Phone Number 281400 and 1077 (Toll free telephone No) round the clock and the staff of Collectors Office, Ongole will be drafted to attend the control room duties.

DISTRICT DISASTER MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY (DDMA)

HAM RADIOS

- Ten (10) Ham Radio sets (HF sets), in Prakasam District and these sets are under the control of the Secretary, Ham Radio Club, Collector's Office/ Ongole. The Collector has directed the Secretary, Ham Radio Club, Ongole to keep the all Ham Radio sets in good condition. One H.F set installed at Ongole Ham radio club for cyclone weather condition linked with District to Secretariat relief control room.

WIRELESS SETS

- Wireless sets in entire Prakasam District is not working.

DISTRICT SUPPLY OFFICE / D.M. CIVIL SUPPLIES

- The Commissioner of Civil Supplies, AP, Hyderabad issued instructions to take immediate action for advance possession of ECs in cyclone prone areas during heavy rains / floods for using the same for immediate relief to the cyclone victims as there will be damages to the roads and tanks disrupting the transport system . The Tahsildars in the coastal areas are requested to place advance indents with the DM, APSCSC Ltd., Ongole for positioning rice in the FP Shops in the villages/ habitations that are likely to be affected during the above cyclone period. The quantity released may be reduced in three equal installments from the subsequent monthly allotments.
- The FP Shop Dealers located in the villages and habitations which are likely to be affected during cyclone period are directed to act as food incharges in consultation with the Habitation committee members appointed by the Collector. They can also utilize the rice stocks available with the Head Masters in the Mid Day Meal scheme in emergency cases. They have to distribute the rice stocks as per the directions of the Tahsildars. They have to make arrangements for distribution of food packets to the affected persons in the village/ habitation as per the directions of the Tahsildars.

FISHERIES DEPARTMENT

- ❖ Issue of cyclone warning to all the Marine Fishermen, not to venture fishing & to keep their craft away from the coast.
- ❖ To keep the cyclone relief boats with OBMs readily available for evacuation of low lying / flooding area fishermen along with active swimmers
- ❖ To alert shore stations in the districts with VHF sets and Transistors, Generator & Battery at Ramayapatnam, Chinaganjam.
- ❖ Distribution of Pamphlets, conduct of awareness camps and making the active teams for different purposes during natural disasters.
- ❖ To activate the village action teams /resumes teams with cyclone kits and active swimmers as specified below.

1. Alert & .Evacuation Team
2. Relief camps organization Team
3. Village security Team
4. Medical & First Aid Team
5. Boats/ Engines & nets Keeping Team

CYCLONE RELIEF BOATS

- The Assistant Director of Fisheries, Ongole shall keep the boats ready in vulnerable places to evacuate the people and identify the boatmen to serve as boat drivers. There are 4 Fiber boats available with Fisheries Department in Prakasam District. One boat is kept in the HSD oil bunk, Vodarevu, Chirala (M) and 2 two boats at Singarayakonda and (1) one boat at N.G.Padu MRO office. The above 4 boats are in good condition and under the control of Assistant Director of Fisheries, Ongole. In addition to that, 11 boats with 5 swimmers in each boat are kept ready in 10 coastal mandals. The Assistant Director of Fisheries, Ongole has proposed for purchase of two new relief boats during the year 2016-17 and proposals were submitted to the Commissioner of Fisheries, Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad for allotment of budget.

IDENTIFICATION OF ACTIVE SWIMMERS:

- The Fisheries Development officers will identify the active fishermen, young experienced swimmers in the coastal mandals / Villages and listed them, to participate in the flood relief activity .These lists will be with the concerned MRO for attending emergency flood relief operations if any.

DISTRICT MEDICAL & HEALTH DEPARTMENT:

- In view of cyclone threat during the months of April, May, October and November, the Coastal area Mandals of Chirala, Vetapalem, Chinnaganjam, N.G.Padu, Ongole, Kothapatnam, Tangutur, Jarugumalli, S.Konda, Ulavapadu and Gudluru likely to be hit by cyclone and tidal waves as such the following 10 teams of doctors with Para Medical Staff are deputed as reserve teams. The Medical Officers and Para Medical Staff are deputed to have reported for duty soon after hearing the first warning of cyclone through Radio or Office and to report at the District Cyclone cell in the District Medical & Health Officer's office, Ongole immediately and they should be kept as reserve team at District Cyclone cell for utilization of services when ever and where ever necessary.
- If any Para Medical Staff are vacant or already on leave neighbouring an nearest Para Medical Staff should be deputed by the Medical Officer, PH Centre, concerned.

Medicines:

- Collector and District Magistrate, has issued instructions to the DM & HO, Ongole, DPO, Ongole and Municipal commissioners to maintain the stocks in the cyclone stores containing the following items and other necessary medicines and formed medical team well in advance by the DM & HO, Ongole.
 1. Bleaching powder.
 2. Chlorine tablets to utilize for water purification .
 3. Antibiotics, Anti-pireties, Analgesics
 4. I.V. Fluids.
 5. All other medicines for first aid .
 6. Sanitation related medicines (DPO, Ongole, Municipal Commissioner)
- The DM & HO, Ongole shall keep sufficient medicines to keep sufficient life save drugs also in the primary health centers situated in coastal areas and also in vulnerable areas in the other part of the District. He is requested to prepare action plan with required number of teams well in advance.

ANIMAL HUSBANDRY DEPARTMENT

- Prakasam District is prone to cyclone during May, October and November months every year.

PRE-CYCLONE PREPAREDNESS :

- Sufficient quantity of vaccines as a forecast requirement with the knowledge of previous demand has been procured and kept ready. Sufficient quantities of emergency medicines are stocked at vulnerable places. Teams were constituted consisting of one Veterinary Assistant Surgeon/one Para Staff and one or two Attenders on permanent basis. The teams will rush to the affected villages and take up relief works. First aid kits are made available for each team with medicines to take care of affected livestock and keep urgency life saving medicines. Instructions were given to Animal Husbandry officers to take necessary action with coordination of local Municipality/Gram Panchayat and local voluntary organizations etc., Preventive inoculations against Hemorrhagic Septicemia has been conducted in all vulnerable villages in coastal belt.
- The Joint Director, Animal Husbandry, Ongole has been instructed to keep sufficient drugs and vaccine to prevent deceases to the livestock during the cyclone period.

RURAL WATER SUPPLY SECTOR:

ACTION PLAN BEFORE CYCLONE

- Identification of Cyclones effected habitations in advance.
- Designate a Section Officer for emergency response and will act as the contact person for that Department / Agency.
- Review and update Precautionary measures and procedures and especially ascertain that adequate stock of safe drinking water and other inpur are available in areas prone to Natural Calamities.
- Provision of safe water to all Habitations as and when required.
- Clearance of Drains and sewerage Systems, particularly in the Cyclone affected areas.
- Prior arrangement of water tankers and other means of distribution and arrange water storage tanks to fill as & when required
- Prior arrangement of stand - by generators.
- Stock-Pipe of sand bags and other necessary items for breach closure at the Panchayat level near by tanks.
- Taking up at least 2 Mobile Vans of a responsible civilians of each village in advance for communities at the time of Cyclone.
- Carrying out emergency repairs of damaged water supply schemes.
- Annual assessment of danger levels & wide publicity of those levels.
- Identify flood prone areas and activate flood monitoring mechanisams.
- Provide water level gauge at critical points along the Rivers, Dams and Tanks.
- Identify and maintain of materials / tool kits required for emergency response.

ACTION PLAN AFTER CYCLONE

- Monitoring Flood situation.
- Dissemination of Flood warning.
- Ensure accurate dissemination of warning meassages naming GPs & Mandals with details of flow & likely damage.
- Monitoring and protection of DW Tanks.
- Inspection of villages & aware the public not only in water supply but also to advise them to overcome the situation Physically & Mentally.
- Inspection and repair of pumps, generator, motor equipments, station buildings (Pump houses etc.,)
- Review and documentation.
- Sharing of experiences and lessons learnt with departmental Engineers.
- Development of checklists and contingency plans.

ROAD & BUILDINGS DEPARTMENT:

- The SE, R&B, Ongole has been deputed the officers to look after the damages interruptions to clear the obstructions on roads to make read free from interruptiuons, duly attended the repairs during the floods. The Executive Engineers, R&B, N.H., authorities, Ongole and Executive Engineers, Panchayat Raj, Ongole, Kandukur are instructed to inspect all the culverts, weak bridges, roads and side-drains in coastal areas and see that they are maintained in good condition at vulnerable points. They should ensure free flow of traffic by strengthening the diversion roads etc. They should take adequate measures to store the required material like Sand bags, Cement etc. well in advance at the places likely to breach so that immediate repairs and restoration works can be taken up after the cyclone if breaches occur. They are also instructed to remove all the dead or dying trees on the road sides. The Superintendent Engineer, R&B, Ongole is instructed to furnish the requirement of Power Saws. And also requested to submit the details of alternative ways (roads), if the existing roads breaches in the cyclones. It is also directed to contact the owners of the proclainers well in advance to provide them to clear off the obstacles on road at the time of post cyclone measures.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

- In Fire Department there are man made Disasters and Natural Disasters to face the consequences of cyclonic Disasters and arranged One fire tenders with rescue equipment i.e. 5 life boys, 10 life Jackets and 5 ropes with good swimmers to rescue people from marooned buildings of cyclonic waters. As instructed by the District Collector & Magistrate, Ongole, orders were issued for mobilizing the fire units to the costal villages on hearing the cyclonic warning without waiting for orders.

IRRIGARION DEPARTMENT:

Arrangements for Pre-Disasters in jurisdiction of Irrigation Circle:

In the jurisdiction of Irrigation Circle, Ongole, 363 Nos. of Minor Irrigation sources with registered ayacut of 115650 Acres, 589 Nos. of P.R.Tanks with an ayacut of 19777 Acres and 5 Nos. of Medium, Irrigation with registered ayacut of 48259 acres are maintained. The F.O's are constituted for Medium Irrigation sources only.

To tackle the situation arising out due to Natural disasters during the ensuing flood season / cyclone, issued suitable instructions and take precautionary measures to the field officers concerned as noted below.

All the vulnerable locations in the sources are to be identified along with the Water Users Associations / Distributory Committees / Project Committees While conducting field survey,,the following aspects are considered.

1. The sluice gates of the tanks got serviced and kept ready for operation.
2. Keep the man power and material ready for operation and communicate the each one to the concerned.
3. Wherever vulnerable reaches identified, to make necessary arrangements, for intensive patrolling of tank bund, surplus course bund and supply channel bunds etc.,
 - Further maintenance of flood stores by procuring requisite numbers of empty cement bags, sand, Casurina, bellies, bamboos, binding wire, dewatering pumps, generator at vulnerable places whichever necessary..
 - After receipt of first flood warning discharge through dams all lower riparian rights villages downstream of the dam are required to be given the information along with the District Collector / RDO / MRO of the concerned District.
 - Canal operation plan for disaster management should be implemented to control the entry of flood to the canals as the flood water is mixed with sand.
 - Before the cyclone / flood the AEE / DEE will inspect each and every vulnerable points and the areas prone for inundation for taking precautionary temporary measures and the summary of all actions intimated to the higher officers.

To set up turn duties in the Circle Office/Division Office /Sub Division Offices now onwards round the clock to Monitor the situation and communicate to flood control room situated in the Office of the Engineer-In-Chief and Collector Office and required vehicles are the kept ready for inspection as well as to carry the man & material to site required.

Instruct all filed staff concerned for alert and raise up to occasion as per flood warning being given in the TV / Radio and Media communication etc., and also obtain advance information and take up precautionary measures wherever necessary.

To close the head regulator/ gates and maintain constant vigil in case of flood conditions round the clock.

After receipt of 1st warning the departmental field officers have to inspect all the vulnerable sources in the jurisdiction including the luskers and report the updating.

After receipt of 2nd warning the departments have to attend to the patrolling duties of flood points along with district administrator. If any damages occurs the damages are to rectified within and loss by local arrangements.

On receipt of 1st and 2nd warnings the necessary contract No's of the all the staff has to be communicated to district administration for easy and enable coordination.

Post Disaster:-

The post disaster management will be carried based on the Govt. guidelines from time to time.

DISTRICT PANCHAYAT OFFICE

There shall be a village level committees in Gram Panchayats to take necessary action in Gram Panchayat level to prevent disasters due to cyclone and floods. The Committees shall be constituted as follows

1.	Sarpanch	:	Chairman
2.	A.N.M.	:	Member
3.	Anganwadi worker	:	Member
4.	Non-Governmental Organization	:	Member
5.	Co-ordinate committees	:	Member
6.	Panchayat Secretary	:	Convener

The above formed committee as to take necessary steps to prevent disasters due to cyclone and fleets.

1. Concerned Gram Panchayat Special Officer and Secretary at the time of cyclone has to shift all the peoples to the protection shelter of the cyclone.
2. Chlorine tablets have to distribute from house to house (In the advice of the Medical Officer.) under supervision of Special Officer and Panchayat Secretary.
3. Stock the Bleaching and Phenol at Gram Panchayat level frequently.
4. Keep the Petra mass lights and Torch lights readily with good condition.

All the Extension Officers (PR & RD), are directed to issue instructions to the Special Officer and Panchayat Secretaries to prevent epidemics in their respective jurisdiction.

The MPDOs and Divisional Panchayat Officers, are directed to issue necessary instructions to the Special Officer and Panchayat Secretaries in their jurisdiction to prevent disasters time to time.

The District Panchayath officer, Ongole shall issue instructions to all the Panchayat Secretaries and Special Officer of Coastal villages and other vulnerable

areas to purchase adequate bleaching powder, Chlorine tablets from general funds to use during cyclone period for maintaining hygienic conditions in flood prone low lying areas.

A.P.S.R.T.C.

In Prakasam District there are Eight A.P.S.R.T.C. Depots located at ADDANKI, CHIRALA, KANDUKUR, ONGOLE, GIDDALUR, KANIGIRIMARKAPUR, PODILI

47 Cyclone affected routes where dislocation of operation of buses in Prakasam Region are identified.

Depot Managers are advised to post one Traffic Supervisor at the spot where floods occurred to monitor and give instructions to the Crew according to the situation prevailing on the spot with the advise of the Revenue and Police authorities.

In case of breaches/over flows the Depot Authorities are canceling the services with preplan cancellation on the routes expected flood & breaches of Tanks

The following contingency plan of action is being adopted by A.P.S.R.T.C. in case of Natural Disasters.

- round the clock communication cell will be organised at the regional office to know the cyclone/flood position and to take necessary relief activities with the instructions of district administration.
- some buses are kept ready for the disposal of district administration to transport public from dangerous areas to safest places.
- in case of road breaches the depot authorities and supervisors attending to the spots and arranging relief to the stranded passengers.
- utmost care is being taken to operate buses where there is possibility of over flow of water over culverts /roads.
- close liaison with the district authorities and police authorities is maintaining during cyclonic period and buses are being operating on their advice.

AGRICULTURE DEPARTEMENT

In view of the cyclone threat in the months of April, May, October and November in the Coastal Mandals of Chirala, Vetapalem, Chinaganjam, N.G.Padu, Ongole, Kothapatnam, Tangutur, Zarugumalli, S.Konda, Ulavapadu and Gudlur, the following action plan is prepared for mitigating the cyclone damages.

During Cyclone:-

- Coordinate with field level staff to get feedback on seriousness of disaster, level of distress, steps to be taken for saving standing crop and estimation of the flooded areas.
- Coordinate with line department officers in creating awareness on the intensity of the situation and the possible measures to be taken up..

Post Cyclone Action Plan:-

1. Village and Mandal level teams should visit the affected areas and estimate the losses occurred to standing crops.
2. Depending on the intensity of the damage take possible remedial measures immediately.
3. Ensure timely relief to farmers for purchase of agricultural inputs through Govt. /private agencies and ensure immediate reschedule of loans through banks.
4. Seeds, fertilizers and pesticides should be made available and supplied on subsidy. Ensure all possible relief measures
5. Fodder should be supplied in sufficient quantities at subsidized prices.
6. The enumeration team should prepare list of affected farmers who is cultivating the field.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Prakasam District generally experiences cyclone/floods during the month of October/November/April/May. After receipt of cyclone warning information from the observation Department, the following contingency action plan has to be implemented by the District Police by war footing. The concerned SDPOs/CI s and

SI s should visit the coastal villages along with staff, which are lying with in the radius of ten KMs of the Coast , rivers and near the tanks which are likely to be submerged to take precautionary measures to evacuate the people from low lying areas by maintaining liaison with all the concerned Departments to avoid loss of human lives besides taking the steps for free flow of traffic , removal of traffic obstructions on NH .5 .

Deployment of force:-

Following is the deployment of officers and men to the coastal Police Stations to assist other agencies in relief and rescue operations, to ensure free flow of traffic on NH-5 by removing traffic obstructions and to maintain law and order during cyclone period.

Addl. SP [Admin], Ongole is the over all incharge for the entire bandobust. He will maintain liaison with all the District officers and monitor the cyclone situation and alert the field officers.

All the above CIs along with the available civil force from their circles have to move to the Mandals allotted to them immediately soon after receipt of cyclone information maintain liaison with the other agencies and involve in relief and rescue operations in their allotted Mandals. SDPO Ongole is the over all in-charge for the entire bandobust in Ongole Sub-Division.

Deployment of Armed Forces:-

DSP AR Ongole will depute 5 ARPCs and 5 Home Guards each to the following coastal Police Station Headquarters to assist the civil Police and other agencies in rescue and relief operations.

DSP AR Ongole will also provide search lights,/ dragon-lights, ropes, rain coats, live jackets and other equipment required to the armed force deputed for relief and rescue operations.

Communication net work:-

1. Control room has to be opened in every SDPO Office.

2. Inspector, Communications have to install static VHF Sets at the coastal villages and also provide man pack sets to the officers wherever required by maintaining liaison with the SDPOs/CIs concerned and ensure effective communication net work during the cyclone period.
3. SB Inspector-II is the incharge of SB Control and alert the concerned Police and to collect information about the developments in Coastal areas and disseminate the same to the concerned officers of various departments to take follow up action in implementing relief and rescue operations. He will keep inform all developments to the SP Prakasam.

INDUSTRIES CENTRE

The following Industries are located on the banks of rivers of Manneru and Paleru.

There are nearly 20 Rice Mills located in the Karamchedu Mandal. Where as Sl.No 5&6 mentioned above are located near by sea shore.

The above industries are prone to be affected during the floods.

Hence, the managements of the above Industries will be informed in advance through Notices that they have to take all precautionary measures to protect their employees from Flood waters. In case any employee gets trapped in the Flood water, the cost of rescuing him/her and other costs such as life compensation/injury compensation will be recovered from the respective managements of the Industries concerned.

TELE COMMUNICATIONS

The District Manager, BSNL, Ongole is hereby instructed to open special telephone cell especially during cyclone period. He should keep in reserve men and material ready for moving into the area at short notice for restoring the communication system in case of cyclone contingency and he is further requested to construct communication towers to the vulnerable villages in the coastal areas and to take action for improvement of the communication systems. **He is further requested to take steps to activate the toll free no.1077 to entire district and at present this facility available to Ongole and surrounding mandals only.**

EDUCATING THE PUBLIC:

The District Public Relation Officer, the District Panchayat Officer, coastal Tahsildars and Special Officers relating to coastal Mandals were instructed to take steps to educate the public about the precautionary measures and the effects of the cyclone as the people living in low-lying areas and other cyclone and flood prone areas may not be willing to leave their dwelling houses even after issue of cyclone/flood warnings.

Pre-Disaster

1. Action is being taken to educate the people living in coastal vulnerable places well in advance through News papers, T.V., Photo Exhibitions, Song and Drama programmes. The pamphlets during cyclone will be permitted and distributed to the people in coastal area through Tahsildars.
2. Slide shows on cyclone precautions will be organized in the cinema halls.
3. Information about cyclone conditions will be given to the Press reporters and Electronic Media through press briefings and S.M.S. at District Headquarters.

On receipt of First Warning

1. Cyclone information centre will be organized at the District Head Quarters and message about hazard warnings from the authorities will be passed on to the public through available communication systems.
2. Timely information about precautionary measures will be furnished through Print and Electronic Media and Local Cable T.V. Network and see messages reach common man with in short period.
3. Regular press briefings will be organized at District Head Quarters time to time and information about the warning along with connected photographs will be given to the media.

On receipt of Second Warning

1. Information about the hazard given in the warnings and the effects on people will be conveyed through all means available to people in the vulnerable areas will be information through Local T.V. Channels and P.A. systems of this department about the expected danger and advised the public to move to the safer places high ground etc.,
2. Information on establishment of relief shelters and medical camps, availability of food, medicines etc., will be given to the people in the affected areas through available communications systems.

3. Daily press meetings will be conducted in consultation with District Administration to avoid false rumors and disseminate the action plans being executed by various departments.
4. Regular feedback reports on relief and rehabilitations will be submitted to the Higher authorities for improvements. Press tours will be conducted in affected Areas; photo and video coverage will be done.

Post Disaster

1. District Public Relations Officer will liaison with Media and arrange good publicity about relief camps, supply of material to shelters, medical camps, distribution of rice and Kerosene, compensation etc., through media and other communications systems. Collecting feed back from affected public and submit same to the higher authorities.
2. Photo exhibition on damages and relief centre will be arranged during the visit of central teams.

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
